Monday, January 18, 2016: The Guest Speaker is Lyall Higginson, MD, PhD and the Topic is "Biggest change in 30 Years." Dr. Lyall Higginson is a clinical cardiologist in the Division of Cardiology at the University of Ottawa Heart Institute and Professor of Medicine at the University of Ottawa. Dr Higginson is committed to undergraduate and graduate medical education and has been an active professor and mentor throughout his career. He was recognized for his commitment to teaching in 2006 when he received the Distinguished Teacher Award from the Canadian Cardiovascular Society (CCS).

In 2012, Dr. Higginson received both the Canadian Cardiovascular Society Annual Achievement Award and the Queen Elizabeth II Diamond Jubilee Medal in recognition of his outstanding contributions to Canada over the course of his career.
