# Monday, January 16, 2017: Guest Speaker: Robert Reid PhD, The title of his presentation is "Patient Engagement in Research"

Robert Reid, PhD, is Deputy Division Head, Prevention and Rehabilitation at the University of Ottawa Heart Institute, and a Full Professor in the Faculty of Medicine at the University of Ottawa. Dr. Reid leads the Ottawa region strategic research Innovation Cluster on Behavioural and Environmental Interventions and Personal and Community Cardiovascular Health.

Dr. Reid obtained his PhD in Health Studies at the University of Waterloo in 1997 following an MBA in Marketing from the University of Ottawa in 1990. He is one of Canada's leading health behavior change experts, particularly concerning smoking cessation, physical activity promotion, dietary change and cardiovascular rehabilitation.
